## IMPACT STATEMENT 2020-21

For the academic year 2020/2021 Ladywood School's allocation was used in the following ways to raise attainment:

- An Enrichment Programme across the whole school which will support attainment in Speaking and Listening, Communication and Social Interactions.
- To provide enhancement resources for Health and Wellbeing including outdoor learning provision, therapeutic practices and mindfulness.
- To link funding to Assessment data and School Improvement priorities Writing, LAC reading, Therapeutic Curriculum, Communication in maths, Engagement and Pupil Voice.
- To provide Sensory assessments, Sensory profiles and Sensory equipment to promote behaviour for learning and development of learning skills.
- To provide children with music lessons to improve communication and listening skills.

- ✤ Staff attendance at professional meetings
- **4** Staff time to deliver parental training and support.

- To provide bespoke equipment to support and enhance the physical development of pupils.

## IMPACT

There are no noticeable differences between our PPG children, in EYFS or KS1/2 with children making on 3 points progress in all areas. The data has shown that the implementation of interventions and strategies has impacted positively on our children and diminished loss of learning.

Our PPG children where offered a range of enrichment experiences including music lessons and work with a dance artist.

Staff where trained in holistic practices such as story massage and the therapeutic classroom in order to focus on wellbeing and readiness for learning.

Senior staff and class staff attended required meetings including Child Action and Early help discussions. This enabled a holistic and multi-disciplinary approach to raising attainment.

Data shows 1% PPG children made below expected progress in maths , however on average they still made 3 points progress in number and shape space and measure.
